# VIRGINIA 2010 COMMERCIAL GRAPE REPORT





## 2010 Growing Season

An early April warming pattern advanced bud break by two or more weeks in 2010. This was followed by scattered frosts in late-April and again on May 10, which took a toll on some of the state's vineyards, particularly those in the more northerly areas of the state.

Precipitation was at or above normal through bloom. Established vines had ample soil moisture reserves carried over from heavy snows of winter to meet early season needs. As temperatures climbed and clouds disappeared in mid- to late-June, moisture deficits began to be noticed in some areas, particularly in the northern Shenandoah Valley, Virginia's historically driest region. The 2010 season will be remembered as one of the hottest and driest on record for the modern Virginia wine industry.



Grape harvest was significantly advanced, owing to the very early bud break and the combination of heat and some drought stress. Some vineyards were seeing harvest advanced by as much as three weeks.

Fruit quality was very good. Sugar levels were typically higher and titratable acidity was often lower than normal,

both of which can occur due to heat-induced dehydration and increased respiration. Disease and many of our chronic insect problems were lower than normal.

## About the Survey

Office has managed the annual Commercial Grape Report data collection and reporting. The report was formerly produced by NASS (National Agricultural Statistics Service). The survey questions were identical to those used by NASS; however, the capture of information was slightly different. This year's survey drew upon exact data provided by Virginia grape producers. There was no statistical modeling, or historical data of individual sites to compare responses from 2010 with the 2008 NASS (the last year NASS provided this service for Virginia). Therefore this year's survey data will be different in nature from previous surveys.

This year marks the first time the Virginia Wine Board Marketing

The Virginia Wine Board Marketing Office captured the individual responses and reported the collective data generated by those individual responses; however, this survey is only as accurate as the information provided.

The information presented in this report was gathered through a census of all known grape producers in Virginia. Data was collected during the months of November 2010 through February 2011 by mail, telephone interview and online individual responses. Information obtained during the course of this survey was kept completely confidential. Only aggregate information is presented in this report.
